Quinns Beach Primary School, located 15km north of Joondalup, provides education for students from Kindergarten to Year 6. Our motto, "Dream, Explore, Discover," reflects our commitment to fostering academic, social, and emotional growth for lifelong success.

We offer a well-rounded education, supported by specialist programs in Music, Art, Physical Education and Science. Our dedicated staff work closely with students, parents, and the community to ensure every child feels valued and supported.

We embrace diversity, with 11% of students identifying as First Nations and 18% of students requiring learning adjustments as identified in our school's Nationally Consistent Collection on School Students with a Disability data (NCCD).

As part of the Northern Beaches Education Network, we collaborate with other schools to provide additional learning opportunities for both staff and students.

We have a very active School Board and P & C whose support and collaboration has been greatly appreciated and valued throughout the 2024 school year. Commencing our new nature playground has been one of our highlights.

Our inclusive and supportive environment ensures each student is equipped to succeed. At Quinns Beach Primary, our committed staff are committed to preparing students for future challenges while providing a strong foundation for their future.

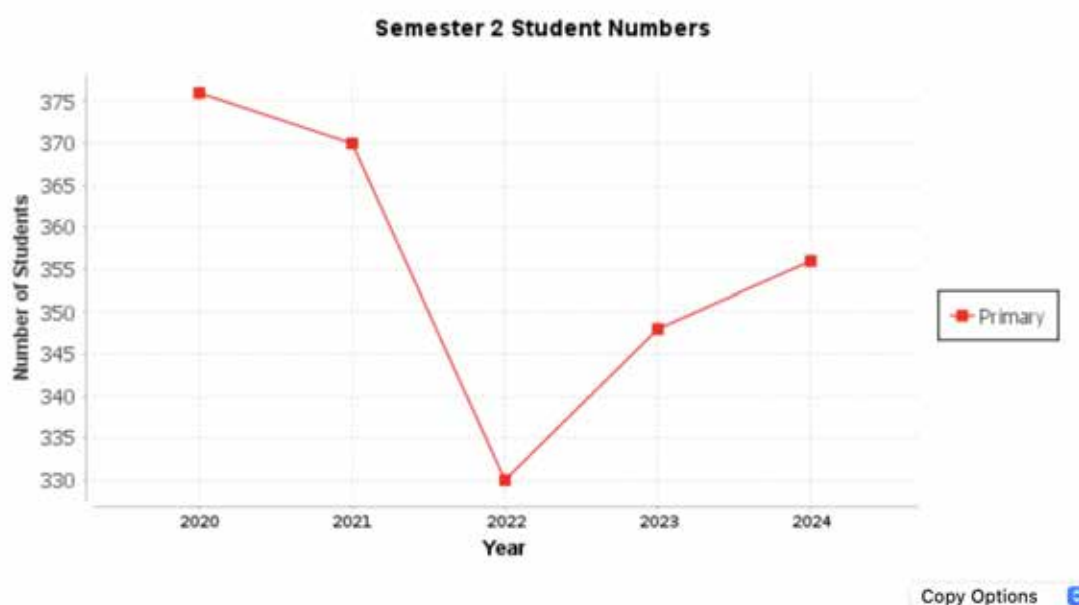
Student Numbers - Trends

Comments:

Staffing at Quinns Beach Primary School remained fairly stable over the 2024 school year with only two new staff being employed in Semester 1 to fill teaching positions. In addition, 7 Educational Assistants were employed to support our students with additional needs.

The school was provided funding and professional development to upskill an existing staff member to step into a Complex Behaviour Support (CBS) Coordinator role (DoE initiative). This role was created to support the additional complex behavioural needs of students. The role of the CBS Coordinator is to work collaboratively as part of the Students at Education Risk team. The key focus of the CBS Coordinator is to ensure that students are supported in their learning through a multi-tiered system of support model of service delivery.

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Describe your analysis and impact of evidence:

Quinns Beach Primary School exceeded the WA public schools average and like schools' attendance. It is noted that there is a drop in Aboriginal students' attendance from 2023 to 2024.

Describe how non-attendance is managed by the school:

To ensure the school is identifying and supporting students/families with attendance concerns, the 2025 Student Services Team has a focus on improving attendance for students at risk.

Teaching staff are also upskilled in how to manage attendance at a classroom level, work with families and seek further support from administration if a student's attendance requires case-management.

Term 2 2025 will see the implementation of the DoE initiative Kaartdijin (Compass) which will further support schools in monitoring data providing a more timely and accurate assessment of attendance.

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Describe your analysis and impact of evidence:

For the second year running, NAPLAN Online has changed from the beginning of Term 2 to the second half of Term 1, resulted in the assessment being normed at a different time to previous years. This is important to note as it reflects a different developmental period of the year than any previous test beyond 2022. Schools received their data earlier than previous years enabling our data analysis to have greater impact upon improvement timelines.

NAPLAN-to-NAPLAN progress or previous proficiency levels will not be reported on until 2025. NAPLAN testing domains remain the same – Numeracy, Reading, Writing and Language Conventions.

Our achievement results in the test domains below were close to like school means in Year 3 Reading and Year 3 Numeracy. Year 3 Writing (exceeding band) was also an area of strength.

We will continue to examine, quality assure and adjust our approaches to these areas within our yearly operational improvement processes.

Reading will continue to be a priority across the school with ongoing review of phonemic awareness and phonics as well as the explicit teaching of reading and writing reflective of evidence based, high impact teaching practices.

As part of our new 2025-2027 Business Plan, we are reviewing our numeracy approaches to ensure there is a consistent approach to the explicit teaching of numeracy across the school.

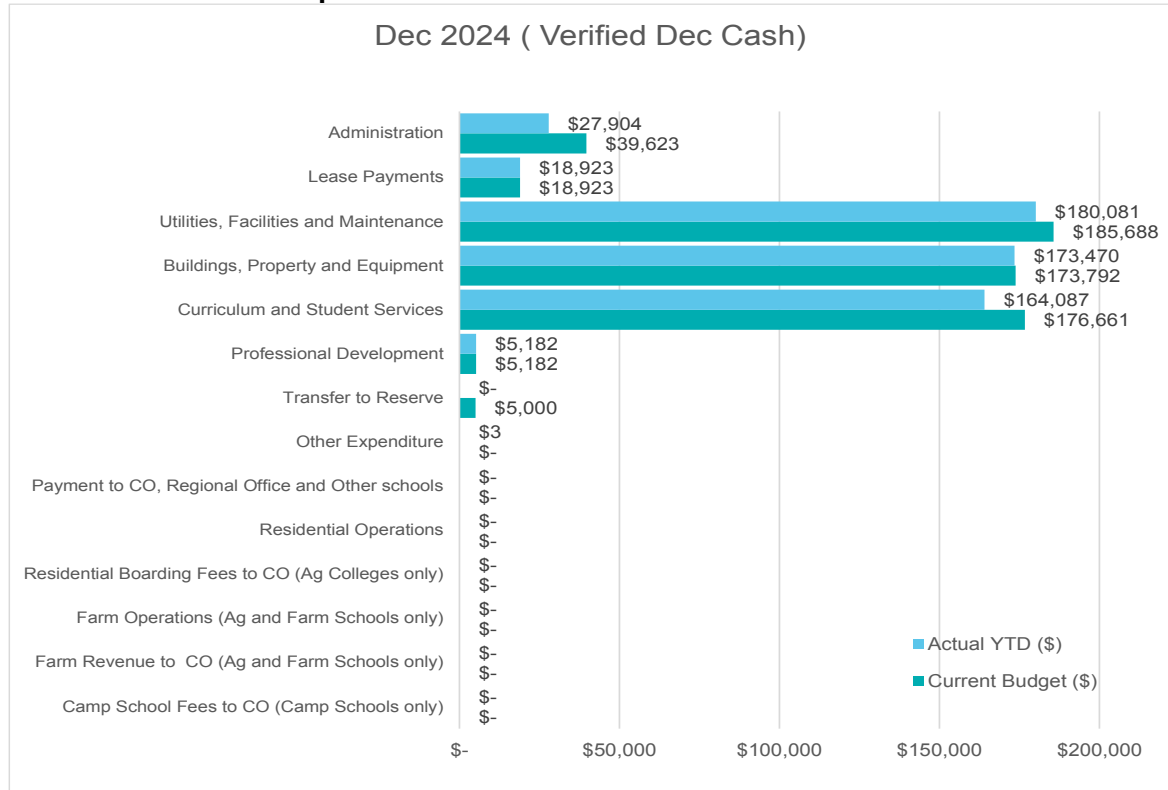

Comments:

46% of our Year 6 cohort will attend Butler College in 2025, our main feeder school. Quinns Beach PS has a close partnership with Butler College as they also form part of our Northern Beaches Education Network. The two schools also worked closely together to ensure transition processes are effectively implemented to support our Year 6 students moving from the primary school setting into the secondary school environment. The other 54% of graduating students will attend either private secondary schooling (40%) or other public secondary high schools (14%).
